

AASC 2025 National SC Conference


National Harbor, Maryland & Washington, D.C.

The RHF Social Service Coordination team proudly represented Retirement Housing Foundation at the American Association of Service Coordinators (AASC) 2025 National Service Coordinator Conference, held in August at National Harbor, Maryland, and Washington, D.C. The weeklong event featured educational sessions led by distinguished experts, workshops, and resource-sharing across the service coordinator profession. It culminated in an impactful day of advocacy on Capitol Hill.

On Advocacy Day, RHF staff joined colleagues from across the country on the steps of the U.S. Capitol and met with offices of Senator Adam Schiff (California), Senator Martin Heinrich (New Mexico), Senator Chuck Grassley (Iowa), and Representative Dave Joyce (Ohio) to raise awareness for the Expanding Service Coordinators Act. The RHF team prepared a package of residents' letters, heartfelt stories, and community photos, led by Diana Pro, MSW, Director of Social Service Coordination. AASC distributed these materials to senators nationwide. These voices rang clear and underscored the vital role service coordinators play in helping residents of federally funded affordable housing to thrive with dignity.

Michelle Ornelas, recently recognized as a Professional Service Coordinator after completing specialized training through AASC and Ohio State University's Office of Geriatrics and Gerontology, personally delivered letters from RHF residents to their respective state offices. This ensured our community's experiences were shared directly with decision-makers. Posters advocating for expanded service coordination and affordable housing, crafted by RHF's Communications Department, were proudly displayed and embraced by conference attendees during Advocacy Day.

Congratulations to Diana Pro, MSW (Director, Social Service Coordination and Treasurer of AASC Southern California Chapter), Michelle Ornelas (Assistant to Director), Margarita Marsetti, and Carol Yeung (Angelus Plaza Service Coordinators) for leading RHF's voice on the national stage.

Angelus Plaza's 24th Annual Talent Show Brings Joy and Connection

On August 22nd, Angelus Plaza in Downtown Los Angeles was filled with heart, joy, and vibrant community spirit as residents took the stage for the 24th Annual Angelus Plaza Talent Show. This beloved event featured 20 talented participants, all aged 55 and older, who showcased a variety of performances ranging from singing and dancing to drums and comedy. More than 300 residents and guests cheered on the performers, sharing in an afternoon of excitement and pride.

The show celebrated creativity at every level, with memorable acts including the fleet-footed Sunset Light Dance Team, this year's top prize winners, who wowed the audience in their military-inspired costumes and declared, "We love dance. We love the people." Second place went to the energetic Korean Drum Circle, third to the Anna Line Dance Group, and fourth to Angel Wang's Group. Angel Wang, a dedicated community volunteer for over 15 years, is renowned for teaching dance and creating costumes for the show, while another standout performer, Larry Leigh, shared a moving musical journey that deepened his connections within the community.

This annual tradition has become a highlight for Angelus Plaza, fostering connections among neighbors and reminding everyone that artistry and performance have no age limit. Special guests, including community partners from Retirement Housing Foundation and PIH Health Good Samaritan Hospital, joined in presenting prizes, raffle gifts, and refreshments, making the occasion even more festive.

Angelus Plaza, which first opened in 1980, is now the nation's largest affordable senior community, home to more than 1,000 residents and a cornerstone of downtown Los Angeles. Through programs such as the Senior Talent Show, Angelus Plaza inspires creativity, combats isolation, and showcases the courage and camaraderie that make this community truly extraordinary.


Need to Come Up With a Great Gift This Year For The Holidays?



Bob Fard Speaks at ULI Panel


On August 6th, Bob Fard, VP of Acquisition and Development, was part of an expert panel for Urban Land Institute LA's StimULI: Affordable Housing for Seniors series held in Downtown Los Angeles. The panel's discussion centered around the multifaceted aspects of senior affordable housing, beginning with the crucial design requirements and supportive services that cater to the specific needs of older adults.



"It was an informative and insightful discussion featuring panelists with a different lens on the senior affordable housing space," said Bob Fard. "We discussed the health and wellness aspect, aging in place gracefully, the thin line between assisted living and independent living for seniors, and probably most importantly, policy makers and elected officials who are allocating too much available funds on homeless housing, which leaves affordable housing providers in a secondary position and deficit for scarce funds if they don't provide homeless housing."

Bob was joined on the panel by other industry leaders, including RHF's 2025 Friend of the Elderly Awardee, Dr. Laura Trejo, Director of the Los Angeles County Aging and Disabilities Department.

According to their website, Urban Land Institute LA's mission is to be the preeminent regional real estate organization providing inclusive and trusted leadership. One of their key priorities is to impact land use and public policy to implement solutions to the homelessness and housing crisis in the Los Angeles region.



General Synod Honors RHF Leader

Retirement Housing Foundation was honored to participate in the PAAM (Pacific Islander and Asian American Ministries) event at the United Church of Christ's General Synod in Kansas City, MO. Longtime RHF board member, Rev. Norma DeSaegher, was celebrated with the PAAM Recognition Award for outstanding service and leadership. Expanding Wellness and Health Integration in Greater Boston: The R3 Program at Hamilton Wade, Douglas House

Residents of Hamilton Wade, Douglas House in Brockton, Massachusetts, are experiencing a new standard of care through the innovative Right Care, Right Place, Right Time (R3) program. Created by Hebrew SeniorLife (HSL) and introduced to our Boston and surrounding communities in partnership with Schochet Companies, the R3 program puts comprehensive wellness support at the heart of affordable senior housing.

With R3, on-site wellness coordinators and nurses work closely with residents and housing staff to proactively address healthcare needs, connect individuals with resources, and organize programs that promote mental and physical wellbeing. This approach is person-centered and emphasizes empowerment, prevention, and whole-person health. R3 offers case management, fitness classes, health education, and individualized support for chronic conditions.

The R3 program began as a grant partnership between HSL, Schochet, Senior Whole Health, the Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs, and community residents. Its proven outcomes include major reductions in hospitalizations and emergency room visits, increased resident satisfaction, and a stronger sense of safety and support. According to recent findings, R3 has resulted in a 25% decline in days spent in the hospital, a 22% drop in 30-day hospital readmission rates, and 90% of identified service needs met for participating residents.



Community vibrancy is enhanced both through wellness services and through strengthened partnerships with healthcare providers and culturally appropriate programming. These services are delivered in a way that makes every resident feel known and valued. The success of R3 at Hamilton Wade, Douglas House is inspiring plans to expand the program to Stearns this fall. The goal is to bring this level of care and connection to more RHF communities in New England in the coming years.

Thanks to the collaboration between HSL, Schochet Companies, and local partners, more older adults can thrive in their own homes while feeling connected, empowered, and supported at every step.

Celebrating Service Coordinators

On Wednesday, September 17, 2025, Angelus Plaza welcomed the Southern California Chapter of the American Association of Service Coordinators (AASC) for a special Service Coordinator Symposium. Unlike the typical quarterly meetings, this event was organized to honor National Service Coordinator Day, celebrated each year on September 19th since 2014.

Social service coordinators from RHF and many other organizations filled the room with enthusiasm, eager to connect, exchange resources, and share experiences. RHF's Director of Service Coordination and Treasurer of the Southern California AASC Chapter, Diana Pro, MSW, played a central role in planning the day and is recognized for her ongoing contributions to strengthening the chapter and symposium each year.

The agenda was centered on recharging and self-care, beginning with an energizing Zumba class, followed by guided sessions in breathwork yoga, tai chi, and laughter yoga. WelBe Health offered insights on the PACE (Program for All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly) program, while Independence at Home shared resources for connecting older adults and caregivers to no-cost services.

These AASC gatherings are vital for the ongoing professional development of social service coordinators, offering fresh perspectives and new tools for supporting residents. Taking time to recharge is essential, ensuring coordinators can return to their communities with renewed energy and effectiveness.



RHF Welcomes Five New Senior Communities in Minnesota

In early August, RHF President and CEO, Stuart Hartman, together with key leaders including VP of Communications Chris Ragon, VP of Affordable Housing Operations, Yuri Escandon, and Director of Operations LaVonne Michelson, traveled to Minnesota to visit five new properties that RHF anticipates acquiring by the end of 2025. The sites included Bethel Manor I & II and Winona Shores in Alexandria, Park Villa in Park Rapids, and Parmly Lakeview in Chisago City.

During the visits, Mr. Hartman met with residents and staff at each community to share news of the upcoming transition. He assured everyone that RHF is committed to continuity and support, and pledged that RHF will continue to care for the communities and the people who call them home.



As the holiday season quickly approaches, we find ourselves reflecting on a year filled with purpose, progress, and generosity.

2025 has been an especially active and rewarding year for RHF Charitable Foundation. Guided by RHF's strategic plan, we focused our efforts on two key pillars: Asset Optimization and Resident & Staff Experience. These priorities shaped many of our funding decisions and helped us deliver meaningful impact across RHF's affordable housing communities.

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our donors, business partners, and in-kind supporters, we were able to provide a wide range of programs and services that enriched lives and strengthened communities.

Here are just a few highlights from the past year:

- ❖ Awarded \$306,275 in Affordable Housing grants for community improvement projects and to assist previously unhoused residents move in to their new RHF home.
- ❖ Provided \$25 gift cards to 1,330 kids living in RHF communities during the 2024 holiday season. (To participate in this year's program, see page 15.)
- ❖ Awarded \$6,250 in Youth Education Scholarships to 10 school-aged kids and young adults in RHF communities.
- ❖ Awarded \$17,075 in Resident Benevolence grants to assist residents with emergency needs and RHF communities impacted by natural disasters.
- ❖ Provided \$35 gift cards for back to school shoes to 1,320 school-aged kids in RHF communities.
- ❖ Awarded \$21,000 to RHF communities for Project H.A.N.D.S. and social service programming.
